NSSS, Brief Report on Awareness Programme on Biodiversity Fair cum Plant Genetic Resource Date: 14th June 2024 Venue: Tengri Village

Biodiversity refers to the variety of life on Earth, encompassing the diversity of species, genetic. Biodiversity and plant genetic resources are crucial components of global ecosystems and agriculture. Dr. S.K Malik highlighted the critical importance of biodiversity and plant genetic resources, emphasizing conservation, protection, and sustainable utilization practices. He urged the younger generation to preserve the Khasi people's rich traditional systems, introduced the concept of Community Seed Centres, and underscored the pivotal role of women in the food system.

Fr. James Anderson Syiemlieh spoke about agricultural practices and expressed gratitude to all stakeholders and contributors whose efforts ensured the success of the event in promoting biodiversity conservation and sustainable development.

The event featured the distribution of agricultural tools to 250 farmers from Eastern West Khasi Hills District, including tarpaulins, sprayer pumps, pipes, bags, and hats, amounting to a total value exceeding 14 lakhs.
